YEAR 12 ACADEMIC UP-REACH

UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE Faculty of Classics

Are you currently studying a Humanities subject or a modern language? Are you interested in the Classical World? Would you like to

- dive into exploring Latin texts from 2,000 years ago?
- deepen your understanding of how language works?
- find out how the Roman world can help us understand the power structures of today?
- find out how and why Classical literature influenced later English literature?

Explore Classics is an up-reach opportunity open to Y12. No prior knowledge of Latin is needed, just the ambition to learn more and to think more deeply about language, culture and identity.

In partnership with the Cambridge University Faculty of Classics, the Explore Classics programme offers:

- 5 one-hour online classes, at 7-8pm on Thursdays (27th April, 4th May, 11th May, 18th May, 1st June)
- classes are free and resources will be provided digitally
- one class will involve a guest speaker from the University of Cambridge
- follow-on opportunities for students keen to take their interest further via the Cambridge Classics Outreach initiatives.
