Lanyards and Cards

You MUST remember to wear your lanyard around school for safeguarding reasons, and also sign in via InVentory.

Please fill in the CAS log (see below). If you haven't already read the CAS booklet which I have put into all your portfolios, please do so for advice on <u>how</u> you should record your CAS. Checking through Year 12 portfolios I can see that some of you simply list hours. Every CAS activity should have a proper introduction explaining what you hope to

achieve and should give full details of the activity. You should also be careful to verify what you have done through the use of photos, certificates and attendance data. Year 13s have been writing their final CAS reflection and I will include some of their advice on how to manage CAS over the next few weeks.

'For year 12s starting CAS I would give the following advice: start early with your work to ensure you reach 50 hours in each section, Log your hours as you go to avoid spending hours logging everything in the last minute, likewise with reflections, and finally, the quicker you reach the target 150 hours, the more time you have left for coursework and exam revision.'

'Some advice I would strongly give to the new Year 12s is to try and find an activity they enjoy, rather than feel like they must complete just because of CAS. It will be more fun having to do an activity you enjoy rather than the one you're obligated to. Also, I would suggest organising your time as much as possible, so later you don't struggle with it. '

Free Bike Marking in Cambridge

We're now preparing for our next event at Cambridge City Station in Station Road on 28 March.

We will be there between 4pm and 8pm to mark your bikes with BikeRegister for free.

The process takes about 10 minutes and follows the below steps:

- 1. Add your bike details to the National Police-approved database
- 2. Mark and protect your bike with a security marking kit
- 3. Reduce the risk of theft by warning thieves that your bike is marked and increase the chances of you being reunited with it if it happens to get stolen.

You'll need to bring your bike and frame number with you (this can normally be found on the bottom bracket of the bike. We also ask that you register with <u>BikeRegister</u> before you arrive.
