Lanyards and Cards

You MUST remember to wear your lanyard around school for safeguarding reasons, and also sign in via InVentory.

<u>It's not too late to apply</u> although the universities are not duty bound to read and repl. CAS Opportunities & Notices

Y12s - A reminder – by the end of this term (only a week away) you should have accrued a MINIMUM of 60 hours of CAS- roughly divided between creativity activity and service.

Many of you have little written up and it is vital that you write up as you go along. Please ensure that you write up in the format, which is described in the CAS booklet, ie an introduction of what you intend to do, and what you hope to achieve, giving details. Then a log of what you do with times and dates. You should also from time to time (roughly one for every 5 hours of CAS claimed) write reflections - remember reflections are not descriptions of what you do.

You also need to upload into your main CAS project folder a proposal outlining your ideas. Remember this needs to be long term, ideally around a term in length and collaborative in nature. The deadline for this is the first day back after the Easter break.

Some advice from a Year 13 - 'Get in there early, have your sections sorted early. It's a little and often thing, it makes life much easier doing it over a long period of time rather than sorting the hours out last minute. Try and have fun with it, because it is such a long-term project it is best to do things you enjoy. It seems like a no-brainer but if you don't, you'll really struggle. Make sure you're collecting evidence, make an album on your phone or in your OneDrive account so everything is in one place. Don't leave it to the last minute.'

Free Bike Marking in Cambridge

Our next event at Cambridge City Station - Station Road on 28 March.

We will be there between 4pm and 8pm to mark your bikes with <u>BikeRegister</u> for free.

The process takes about 10 minutes and follows the below steps:

1. Add your bike details to the National Police-approved database

2. Mark and protect your bike with a security marking kit

3. Reduce the risk of theft by warning thieves that your bike is marked and increase the chances of you being reunited with it if it happens to get stolen.

You'll need to bring your bike and frame number with you (this can normally be found on the bottom bracket of the bike. We also ask that you register with <u>BikeRegister</u> before you arrive.
