## **Lanyards and Cards**

Some more details of these projects are below. Students may apply to participate in multiple projects. Supreme Court Mooting Competition

We offer students the opportunity to compete in our Mooting Competition in association with the Supreme Court. A "moot" simulates a court hearing (usually an appeal), in which participants analyse a fictional case, research the relevant law, prepare written submissions, and then present an oral argument. If you are selected to participate in the competition, you will be paired up with current law students, including students on the Bar Professional Training Course (the course people undertake to become a barrister), who act as "Mooting Mentors". This structure enables you to not only experience court advocacy, but also develop your knowledge of the law and nurture your communication skills with the help of those already pursuing a career in law.

The competition will run on Tuesday and Thursday evenings via Zoom from February to March 2023. The final will be held in the Supreme Court and judged by a Supreme Court justice.

The deadline for applications is the end of January 2023. We recommend that students apply as soon as possible.

#### **Ageel H Noorali Essay Competition**

In partnership with Deka Chambers, BVL runs a legal essay writing competition in memory of barrister, Aqeel H Noorali. The top prize is £1,000 and a mini pupillage (ie, work experience in a barristers' chambers), and there are also cash prizes for runners up.

Students must submit an 800 - 1200 word essay on the following proposition: 'The time has come for the United Kingdom to adopt a written constitution. Please make the case for or against this proposition'.

## Introduction to the Legal System

The Introduction to the Legal System programme gives students a chance to look at a case which was recently heard in the Supreme Court. Participants will review the decision made by the court, before coming to their own conclusions and writing a report outlining their thoughts and giving their own judgments. The project also gives participants the opportunity to learn about the work of the Supreme Court - the highest court in England and Wales - and to engage with cutting edge legal policy, while at the same time learning about the role of our legal system more broadly.

The programme runs from May to June 2023 on Thursday evenings from 6-8pm, via Zoom.
