Lanyards and Cards

You MUST remember to wear your lanyard around school for safeguarding reasons, and also sign in via InVentory.

We are going to add access rights to your student cards so that you can 'beep' in and out of Mud Lane during school hours to help reduce waiting time at the door. This is a privilege and can be revoked if needed. The main rules with this are:

- Immediately let us know if you lose your card so we can remotely revoke the access.
- Do not let anyone in behind you at the door (similar to at the Eden Centre as Jo or I will usually be there to sign them in).

If you have used all 5 choices and are not holding any offers (e.g. if you decline them all) you could use EXTRA which opens 23rd February. <u>Find out more</u>.

If you need to make changes to your application, you may need to contact the university directly. <u>What you need to know</u>.

Make sure you are checking Track to see your offers and spot any deadlines that appear! We will go through this in tutor time too.

<u>It's not too late to apply</u> although the universities are not duty bound to read and repl. If you have applied for both an undergraduate and conservatoire course, you can accept offers though both schemes until you receive your confirmation decisions. <u>Find out more</u> about UCAS Conservatoire applications.

Group 6 does not have any exams. If you are not in an exam, you are expected to be in lessons as normal.

As we enter March this week it's time to remind you that the deadline for submission of your CAS portfolio is only 3 weeks away.

The deadline is FRIDAY 17TH MARCH (St Patrick's day!).

Before that date you should have:

- Filled out the CAS tracker (see below)
- Checked that you have the minimum requisite hours for all 3 components of creativity, activity, and service.
- Carried out a main CAS project which is long term and collaborative in nature.
- Checked that you have achieved all 7 learning outcomes, and explained exactly HOW you think you have achieved them
- Have clearly marked REFLECTIONS (approx. one for every 5 hours of CAS claimed)
- Provided enough EVIDENCE to support the activities you have written about

There is one last thing which everyone needs to do - create a folder marked 'FINAL REFLECTION', and in it write a summary, (about one side of A4) reflecting back over the last two years of CAS.

Here are a few questions which you need to address.

- 1. Were there any areas of the 3 components which you found more challenging than others?
- 2. What personal skills do you think you have learned through doing CAS?
- 3. Do you think that doing CAS provided a contrast to the academic side of IB and allowed you to experience activities such as sport which can help to de-stress?
- 4. Were there any activities which you had not done before and which you started because of CAS?
- 5. What advice would you give the incoming Year 12s about how to organise your CAS.

Free Bike Marking in Cambridge

The process takes about 10 minutes and follows the below steps:

1. Add your bike details to the National Police-approved database

2. Mark and protect your bike with a security marking kit

3. Reduce the risk of theft by warning thieves that your bike is marked and increase the chances of you being reunited with it if it happens to get stolen.

You'll need to bring your bike and frame number with you (this can normally be found on the bottom bracket of the bike.

We also ask that you register with <u>BikeRegister</u> before you arrive.
